### Pros and Cons about the Go-Daddy Hosting Site

#### Pros

- It's cheap

#### Cons

- It takes up to 48 hrs to reload and update page with new content
- Not easy to add new customized features, having major problems with the whole site
- Not easy to add simple accessible features to social media icons

## Reading Order For Blind People

- Blind people uses keyboards to access the information on the computer
- They use screen readers to hear the information
- Website codes need to be accessible for screen readers:
  - Tabindex = "0" = read the next thing on the page
  - Tabindex = "-1" = skip the next thing on the page
- We also needed to add Alt text so that the website could describe the images or information for the blind users

- We are also working on a color blindness button option for people who have black and white color blindness, it's a small amount of people who have it but we think it will be better if we add this option just in case
- We will use the color grey as the background and blue for the text. We got the color combination from the WCAG 2.0 to assure that this color combination is up to their web accessibility guidelines



### Working in Progress contd...

- Lastly we are working on a Dyslexic/Low Vision options so that the users who need the extra assistance can use it
- These fonts could include:
  - Times New Roman
  - Sans-Serif
  - Verdana, Arial, Cambria, Georgia
- Mono Dyslexic and Open Dyslexic are fonts specifically tailored to the dyslexic community so that formations of letters and characters are much clearer
